TASK ORDER ISSUANCE

The ICRP task order process is an efficient and appropriate mechanism for timely responses to the ever changing and increasingly complex international development environment.

Upon submission of the statements of work from the field office, for clearance with the ICRP CTO, the task order CO is responsible for the final selection, negotiation, and award.



AMEX is the small business holder of the ICRP IQC. This grants the task order CO the authority to place task orders directly with AMEX without having to go through the competitive process with the five IQC awardees.

ICRP FACTS

Broad Based Scope- Covers a wide range of conflict management approaches and activities and aims to integrate conflict-sensitivity into all of USAID's activities.

Significant Resources- Five awardees share an IQC ceiling of \$500 million over five years (FY2006-FY2010). USAID may, at the discretion of the Task Order Contracting Officer, sole-source task orders directly to AMEX, the small business IQC holder.

Streamlined Process- Under this IQC, task orders may be awarded through a shorter, simplified process.

Integrated Approach- Takes a rigorous and coordinated multi-sectoral and multi-leveled approach to reducing actual and potential violence and instability.

Prioritizing Local Partners- Emphasizes supporting and building the capacity of local partners by providing access to cutting edge expertise in conflict resolution and peacebuilding.

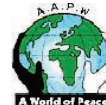
